DAILY ROUTINE

- Children will be collected from the playground by their class teacher.
- Side door will remain open until 9.00am anyone arriving after this time will need to go to the school office.
- Children to change reading book on arrival.
- Early morning work until 9.00 am.
- Assembly at 9.05am on Monday, Wednesday and Friday.
- Achievement assembly Friday

END OF THE DAY

- Children will collect their home time things and line up at the door.
- Class teacher will walk children onto the lower playground.
- Parents to wait over the yellow line.
- Year 2 parents should wait in the center of the playground as Year 1 parents need to wait on the other side.
- Siblings should wait with parents rather than joining the line.
- No bikes or scooters to be used on school premises.

LITERACY

- Literacy is taught daily in a cross curricular context where possible.
- Guided reading takes place everyday.
- Each group will read with the teacher and complete a comprehension activity.
- Reading records will be collected at this time, signed and returned as soon as possible.
- Phonics will be taught daily. We will be revising phonemes from Year 1 and alternative spellings to begin with.

WRITING

 Children will be practicing cursive handwriting.

Emphasis on

- Structured sentences that make sense.
- Using punctuation correctly.
- Ambitious vocabulary WOW words

READING

- Please aim to read a variety of materials at home and ensure plenty of discussion.
- All children keep a reading book in their tray which they are encouraged to read as often as possible.
- Children are encouraged to independently choose a reading book to take home.

NUMERACY

- We will cover numbers and the number system; calculation; solving problems; measure, shape and space.
- Numeracy is still taught in a variety of ways, as in Year 1, to ensure secure understanding and progression in learning.
 For example; written recording, whiteboard work and practical number games.
- The children will be encouraged to use a range of manipulatives to further embed their knowledge and understanding.

Thinking Skills

- → We are working very hard as a whole school, to teach children to become life long, successful learners by giving them the skills to develop their thinking.
- → We use our STAIRS to Success (Self-confident, Tenacious, Aspiring, Independent, Responsible, Sensible) to get children thinking about their thinking.
- → We are also trying to get all children to be active, creative learners who can think outside the box and justify their thoughts. Your child may bring home 'Thinking Skills' homework which may ask them to explore their views on a question. You can help your child develop these skills by questioning them and encouraging them to question you.
