Year 5: Expectations

- Pupil/parent/teacher partnership
- Individual responsibilities
- Home learning diary - communicating with each other. (Need in school *every Monday.*) If there isn't any homework, it will be recorded in their diary.
- Please sign at the weekend, for the previous week, to show you are monitoring homework.
- Reading Record Book is checked every Friday. Should be reading at least five times a week and signed.
- Children need to take responsibility for their own learning - be organised, ready to learn, think about what they are learning and what they have learned.

KS2 Homework

This will be a consistent approach, with flexibility for teachers to plan homework according to need.

- Mathematics - online activities, which will be set by the teacher.
- Literacy Planet – online activities, which will be set the teacher.
- Learning Journey Challenges – one per week.
- Tables and spellings to be practised at home and tested in school the following week along with additional unseen words that follow the spelling pattern learnt. (these will be sent home weekly).
- Reading to be completed at least 5 times a week.

HOME LEARNING

- Feel free to monitor your child's homework but they must complete the activities as independently as possible. With oral work e.g. spelling/tables, your support will be invaluable. We always try to give the children things to reinforce/extend what we have been doing in school.
- If a child does not understand, we will go over the homework with them at school but they need to tell us or write us a note on homework.
- Please don't leave it until the day it is due in.

Maths: Year 5 Curriculum:

- All children will be expected to:
- Have secure place value to 1,000,000
- Use negative numbers in context.
- Use Roman Numerals to 'M' (1000).
- Use standard written methods for all four operations.
- Confidently add/subtract mentally.
- Use prime/factor/multiples.
- Multiply and divide by powers of 10.
- Use square and cube numbers.
- Convert between units.
- Estimate volume and capacity.
- Understand polygons.
- Reflect and translate shapes.
- Compare and order fractions.
- Add and subtract fractions.
- Link percentages to fractions and decimals.





Times Tables

From 2019 all children will be expected to sit a times tables check at the end of KS2.

Please support your child in learning their times tables.

Trips

READING

- Children have opportunities to read during the week. Please allow your children to read a variety of text types at home also.
- Reading records books should be shared at home, please sign them.
- Some children will read individually in school time.
- We are really pushing independence in reading at whatever level your child is at but **there is still a place for discussion about the story, unknown words and character's motives.**
- Don't feel that you can no longer read to your child - we want the children to love books!



Equipment

- PE days are on: Monday and Wednesday.
- Please make sure that your children have the following items in school every week:
 - Tracksuits
 - Trainers for outdoors (Please can children bring in a plastic bag for muddy trainers.)
 - Plimsolls
 - Shorts
 - T-Shirt
- Jewellery should not be worn on P.E days, but if earrings have to be left in, they need to be covered with Micropore tape. Hair should be tied up.



Equipment

- Painting shirt with name in!
- We have everything your child needs to learn in the classroom.
- If your child chooses to bring in a pencil case, it must be small enough to fit in their tray.
- Children will not need to bring rubbers, scissors or compasses into school.
- Please make sure your child's name is on everything!



Secondary Transfer

- Meeting in June about secondary transfer arrangements.
- You will receive information about the process.
- CATs tests will be sat in May and results will be available to you.
- There will be a parent interview at the beginning Year 6 to discuss your options.



End of Day Arrangements

- We cannot let your child leave with someone else if we have not been informed through the office or a note has been sent in with your child.
- It is very helpful if you give us a wave so the teacher and your child can clearly see where you are standing in the playground.
