Term 4 Overview for Year 5 - 'Gods and Gadgets!'

English

We will begin Term 4 by linking up with Year 1 to write poetry with nature as our theme. We will then continue with our work on Ancient Greek myths, where the children will adapt or invent their own quest myth story which will then be adapted into playscript form to be performed to their peers. Argument and debate will be our focus towards the end of the term.

Mathematics

In Maths, the children will be: using formal methods for multiplication and division; adding, subtracting and multiplying fractions and ratio. Children will continue to develop mental strategies to solve problems, choosing the correct number operation to solve one- and two-step word problems.

Science

The children will investigate simple mechanisms, including gears, pulleys and levers. They will find out that some mechanisms, including levers, allow a smaller force to have a greater effect.



Pupils will design and make a Greek theatre mask using clay. They will use their completed masks to perform a Greek play, which they will adapt from the myth write in English lessons.

Computing

This term children will learn how photos can be digitally altered. They will design their own logos and learn to use Textease.

Greek Day!

We will be celebrating Greek Day during Term 4 (date to follow). The children will be encouraged to dress up and we will explore Ancient Greek clothing, food and re-create the Olympic Games!


History ill continue to st
